Dear Speaker Pelosi, Leader McConnell, Leader McCarthy, and Leader Schumer:

On behalf of the undersigned organizations representing patients, consumers, and small businesses, and members of *No Surprises: People Against Unfair Medical Bills*, we strongly urge you to take immediate action to pass a ban on surprise billing, whether in in the next COVID-19 pandemic response package or otherwise. It is well past time to provide consumers relief from this unfair and often devastating practice, particularly as coronavirus infection rates climb and financial insecurity for families remains at record levels.

Surprise billing was a common and destructive problem prior to the pandemic, and the situation is even more dire now. Press reports continue to underscore the vast number of consumers receiving high, unexpected medical bills related to COVID-19 testing, facility fees, laboratory services, and treatment. Many health policy experts have warned that even surprise bills unrelated to COVID-19 are more likely during the pandemic. As local providers are overwhelmed with COVID-19 patients, families are likely to be pushed to out-of-network hospitals for health emergencies or routine care.

Your leadership in this moment is essential. Congress and the Administration have simply not yet done enough to protect consumers from these unexpected and unfounded out-of-pocket costs. We welcomed the initial steps taken earlier this year to chip away at this problem, including the HHS guidance for hospitals and emergency funding provided in the CARES Act, but failure to enact comprehensive reform has left significant loopholes that has allowed the insidious practice of surprise billing to continue. Every day that goes by puts thousands of additional families at risk of receiving a surprise medical bill.

It's time for action. There is bipartisan, bicameral agreement on a solution with widespread support and the backing of the White House. We urge you to put the needs of families above the frustrations of internal politics, and <u>take immediate action to ban surprise bills</u> to ensure that families can seek necessary care without facing devastating financial burdens at this critical time.
